### Biographical Sketch of Marion Elder Grant

Marion Elder Grant was born 16 March 1900, in Quebec City, Quebec, the daughter of Alice Maud Dunning Fitch and Rev. Donald Grant, Baptist pastor of the First Baptist Church in Quebec City. In 1906 she moved to Wolfville, NS along with her mother and her brother Donald, and took up residence in the Acadia Ladies' Seminary when her mother resumed teaching there.

Ms. Grant received her preparatory education at Wolfville High School and graduated from Acadia University in the Class of 1921 with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology. She followed this with a brief period of teaching at Tufts Cover, NS and at Branksome Hall<sup>1</sup>, Toronto, ON. She then received a fellowship from the Department of Education at the University of Toronto and in 1924 received her M.A. In 1926 Ms. Grant was appointed professor of education at Baylor College for Women in Belton, Texas (now Mary Hardin-Baylor University) and was also appointed Dean of Women. During her time at Baylor she received her D. Paed (Doctor of Pedagogy) from the University of Toronto in 1931, and spent a year studying at the University of London during the 1931-1932 academic year.

Apart from the degrees mentioned above, Marion Grant also took courses at Harvard University (1926 and 1929), University of California at Berkeley (1927) and Chicago University (1954).

In 1936 Dr. Grant returned to Wolfville to assume the position of assistant professor of education at Acadia University, and in 1943 she joined the Psychology Department. She was appointed Dean of Women in 1939 and in 1960 she became a full professor and head of the Psychology Department. Although she retired from teaching in 1963, her professional life continued until her full retirement in 1975.

Aside from her official duties as a professor and Dean of Women, Dr. Grant also assumed many other responsibilities. She served on the Senate of Acadia University, as president of the Associated Alumni of Acadia University, and on the University's Board of Governors. She was also a lifetime member of the Wolfville Branch of the Canadian Federation of University Women. She was a charter member of the Canadian Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Committee, for which she was a delegate to Commonwealth Education Conferences in New Delhi, Zurich, and Ottawa. Dr. Grant was one of the first women to serve on the Board of Deacons of the Wolfville United Baptist Church, was a founding member of the Atlantic Baptist Fellowship, and was involved in the United Baptist Women's Missionary Society.

In her capacity as a psychologist Dr. Grant was a founding member and a clinical psychologist at the Fundy Mental Health Centre in Wolfville, and was a founding director of the Acadia University Institute. She was also a member of the American Psychological Association, the International Council of Psychologists, the Association of Psychologists of NS, and was an honorary fellow of the Canadian Psychological Association.

Marion Grant consequently received several honours over her lifetime. In 1950 she received an honorary LL.D. from the University of New Brunswick and in 1964 she was awarded a Doctor of Civil Laws (DCL) from Acadia University. The lounge in Whitman House at Acadia University was named in her honour. She received the centennial medal of Canada in 1967. She was named Acadia's woman of the century in 1985, and received the Associated Alumni gold medal, struck to commemorate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Acadia's first woman graduate. In 1988 Dr. Grant was given a 50-year pin from the Sir Robert Borden Chapter of the I.O.D.E.

Marion Elder Grant died at the Wolfville Nursing Home on 29 April 1989.

### **Biographical Sketch of Alice Maud Dunning Fitch (Grant)**

Born in New Minas, NS in 1865, daughter of Charles W. Fitch and Nancy Elder, Alice Fitch was the youngest of seven children. She studied at Horton Academy and Acadia Ladies' Seminary before attending Acadia University, becoming its second female graduate when she was awarded a Bachelor of Arts in History on 4 June 1885. The following fall she taught at the Acadia Ladies' Seminary, and at Horton Academy in the spring. Ms. Fitch subsequently became the first woman to receive a Master's degree from Acadia University, in 1886.

From September 1889 to June 1893 Alice taught Latin and History at the Acadia Ladies' Seminary. In 1893 she relocated to Toronto, Ontario where, until 1895, she was the principal of Moulton College. On 17 June 1896, Alice Fitch married Rev. Donald Grant who was then the pastor of the First Baptist Church, Montreal, Quebec. They moved to Quebec City in 1899 and remained for five years. In 1904 they moved to Stratford Ontario, but soon after Rev. Grant became ill and they were forced to move to Santa Barbara, CA.

For undetermined reasons, Alice left her husband in California and returned to Wolfville, NS in 1906 with her children - Donald, then eight years old, and Marion, then six. She and Marion took up residence in the Acadia Ladies' Seminary where she taught Classics (Latin and History) until her retirement in 1925. Donald resided in the town with his aunt, Annie Fitch. After retirement, Alice became the head librarian at the Morse Library, Acadia University, and was the first female member of the Acadia University Senate. Illness forced her into full retirement in the late 1930s. Alice Maud Dunning (Fitch) Grant passed away in March 1946.

### Biographical Sketch of Rev. Donald Grant

Donald Grant was born at Auchnafairn, Grantown-on-Spey, Scotland in 1856, the son of Peter and Ann Grant. Having come to Canada with his family at the age of 16, Donald was subsequently educated at Woodstock College in Woodstock, ON. He then received a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Toronto, and a degree in Theology from the Rochester Theological School, Rochester, NY.

Grant was ordained at Geneva, NY in 1884 where he remained as pastor until 1890. Rev. Grant continued his ministry at the First Baptist Church of Montreal, during which time he married Alice M. D. Fitch in June 1896. He then resigned his position in Montreal in 1899 to become the pastor at the First Baptist Church in Quebec City, where he remained for five years. Shortly after a move to the Ontario Street Baptist Church in Stratford, Ontario, Reverend Grant became ill and the family was forced to relocate to Santa Barbara, CA. in early 1905. By 1906 his wife and two children had moved to Wolfville, NS and the couple thereafter remained apart.

Reverend Grant's ill health and subsequent life in California is somewhat enigmatic. There is very little documentation relating to his time there. Records indicate that he spent significant time in a mental health facility. His illness is never fully explained, nor is his manner of income after his retirement from the ministry. The only immediate family member to attend the funeral following his death from influenza in Santa Barbara, 16 December 1932, was his daughter Marion.

### Biographical Sketch of Donald Alexander Grant

Donald Alexander Grant was born in Montreal, Quebec on April 26, 1898, the son of Rev. Donald Grant and Alice Fitch. During his infancy they lived for a brief period in Quebec City and Stratford, Ontario before his father became ill and they relocated to Santa Barbara, CA. In 1906 Donald, his mother, and sister Marion moved to Wolfville, NS where he took up residence in town with his aunt, Annie S. Fitch. Alice and Marion lived in the Acadia Ladies' Seminary.

Donald received his early education at Horton Academy. For a brief period near the end of the First World War he was in training with the Royal Air Force, although he never saw action. When the war ended, he returned to his studies and graduated from Acadia University with a Bachelor of Arts in 1919. Donald then proceeded to obtain his LL.B. at Dalhousie University after which he spent a year teaching public school in Springside, SK.

From 1923 until the outbreak of the Second World War, Donald worked at the law office of Sylvester R. Curtin in Regina, SK. In 1938, he assumed command of the Regina Naval Division

of the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve. During the War he served as staff officer of many ships including the HMCS Chambly, the first Canadian corvette (along with the HMCS Moosejaw) to capture a German U-boat in battle in 1941.

After the war, Cmdr. Grant retired from the Navy and returned to his law practice. On 7 January 1950, he married Isabelle 'Daisy' Clarke. In 1967 he took over the practice of Judge Walter Clink in Battleford, SK and maintained it until his retirement in 1967. Cmdr. Donald Alexander Grant died on April 26, 1971 in Saskatoon, SK.

### **Biographical Sketch of Annie Sarah Fitch**

Annie Sarah Fitch was born to Charles W. Fitch and Nancy Elder on 12 April 1860, at New Minas, NS. The family moved to Wolfville, NS during her childhood and she resided there all her life. She was educated at the Acadia Ladies' Seminary at the same time as her sister, Alice M. D. Fitch (later Mrs. Donald Grant). Being the oldest unmarried daughter, she remained with her parents and cared for them until their deaths.

Over the course of her life, Annie was involved in the United Baptist Women's Missionary Society as well as the Benevolent Society. She also had the longest continual membership of anyone in the Wolfville United Baptist Church.

From 1906 until about 1919 she cared for her sister Alice's son Donald, while Alice was living in and teaching at the Acadia Ladies' Seminary. Later in life she cared for her ailing sister until her death in 1941. Annie Sarah Fitch died on 8 February 1951.

### **Custodial History**

Following Marion Grant's death, her estate, administered by executor Clara Nowlan Jeffries, donated the material contained in this fonds to the Acadia University Archives. On 27 June 1989, University Archivist Patricia Townsend went to the residence of the late Dr. Marion Grant and gathered the material from its various locations and brought it to the Acadia University Archives. At some point during their storage, files relating to the Atlantic Baptist Fellowship were removed and placed elsewhere; during processing of the fonds, these records were repatriated.

### **Scope and Content**

This fonds consists of five sous-fonds representing the records of five members of the Grant and Fitch families. The majority of records were created by Marion Elder Grant, from whom the fonds was acquired; however, there are also records of her parents, Rev. Donald Grant and Alice Maud Dunning Fitch, her brother Donald Alexander Grant, and her mother's sister Annie Sarah Fitch. A biographical sketch is available for each of these people.

Each sous-fonds is divided into “personal” and “professional” series. The Marion Elder Grant series are further subdivided into subseries as they contain by far the largest volumes of records, including correspondence, research and reference materials, ephemera, personal documents such as diplomas and certificates, genealogical documentation, papers delivered, records documenting her involvement with the Wolfville United Baptist Church and the Associated Alumni of Acadia University, and photographs. There are also a few artefacts.
