Biographical Information¹

Edward Manning was born on 16 October 1766 in Ireland. He was the third son of Peter Manning and Ann Carroll. During the late 1760s, the Manning family moved to the Falmouth area of Nova Scotia. He married Rebecca Skinner on 25 June 1801 and they had three daughters: Nancy, Eunice (d. 1818), and Mary. Although Manning travelled widely, he lived in Upper Canard, Kings Co., NS. He died on 12 January 1851 and is buried at the Canard Burial Ground in Upper Canard, along with his wife Rebecca (d. 1857) and his daughter Mary (d. 1900).

Manning was influenced by the ministry of John Payzant, joined the New Light Congregational Church in Cornwallis, Kings Co., NS, and was ordained as their pastor in 1795. During that time, he preached in New Brunswick and began laying the foundation of Baptist development in that province. He, along with John Payzant, Thomas Handley Chipman, and his brother James Manning at a meeting in 1797, began discussing the establishment of the Nova Scotia Baptist Association; his Plan of Association was adopted in 1800. However, during 1807, Manning left the New Light Congregational Church to form a Baptist church and was ordained their Baptist minister in 1808. He provided leadership and encouragement in the movement towards Baptist foreign and home missions.

In 1828, Manning was elected president of the Nova Scotia Baptist Education Society. He laid the cornerstone of the Horton Academy building in Wolfville in 1830. He also presided over the 1838 meeting of the Nova Scotia Baptist Education Society, which decided to establish a college in Wolfville. In 1843, Edward Manning presided over the first graduation at Acadia College.

Custodial History

The minutes of the annual meeting of the Nova Scotia Baptist Association held in Amherst, NS June 30 – July 2, 1845, state: "Resolved, that deeply impressed with the importance of securing materials for the history of the denomination in Nova Scotia, the Association affectionately requests brethren S.T. Rand, and Isaac Chipman to collect whatever they can obtain relating to this subject; and farther that all publications which can be obtained bearing on this and kindred

topics be deposited as the property of the denomination in the College buildings at Horton". Chipman and Rand started to actively solicit and acquire records, among them those of Edward Manning which, according to the *Christian Messenger*, were brought to Acadia College in 1846.

Page 8 of the *Christian Messenger* of 27 March 1846 states:

"Contributed by Rev. E. Manning...Eight hundred letters to Elder M. from one hundred and sixty correspondents, all relating to the subject of Religion, Education, etc."

However, at the time of processing only 663 incoming letters were found. If the 'eight hundred letters' quoted in the *Christian Messenger* was an exact figure, then it appears that some have been lost since acquisition. However, copies of outgoing records are included in the collection as well as other persons' correspondence – to a total of 764. As there was no file list from the time of the acquisition, it is not possible to determine neither whether '800' was an approximate or an exact number, nor whether outgoing copies were included in that number.

In October 1953, Manning's journals (2/1 – 2/17) were bound by the Acadia University library. In 2003/2004 a conservator removed the bindings and performed conservation measures.
