Biographical Sketch

James Herbert Morrison (nickname "Booby") was born in Truro in 1944 and grew up in Economy, Colchester Co., NS, attending Bass River High School. He attended Acadia University, enrolled in senior matriculation from 1961-1962, beginning a BSc in 1962, transferring to a BA in 1964, graduating with a BA in History and English in 1966, and graduating with a BEd in 1967. He obtained a PhD from the University of Ibadan in Nigeria. Morrison is a professor at Saint Mary's University in the History department; he is a former Dean of Arts and Coordinator of the Asian Studies program at Saint Mary's University. In 2009, Morrison was awarded the Order of Canada.

Morrison lived in Hebb House (1963-1964), Evangeline House (1964-1965), and the New Men's Residence, now Eaton House (1965-1966). Very much involved in extra-curricular activities during his years at Acadia, he was a member of the Physics Society, the Class sports rep, a member of the Liberal Club, a residence monitor, in the University Naval Training Division (military), 1962-1964, on the football team, 1963-1964, a member of the Student Christian Movement Christmas Camp and Treasurer, 1964-1965, on the track team, 1963-1965 (and was manager from 1964-1965), a waiter in the Dining Hall, 1965-1966, sat on the Student Food Committee, 1965-1966, sat on the Student Judicial Committee, 1965-1966, participated in either/or, 1965, wrote poetry in Amethyst, 1966-1967, A.A.A.A. President 1965-1966, and President of the Students' Union, 1966-1967. In the Fall of 1967, Morrison went to Africa with CUSO.
