Acadia Science Library

In addition to the Vaughan Library (which is now chiefly an Arts Library), Acadia also has a Science Library which is located in the New Science Building. This library offers full library services. It is air-conditioned, well illuminated and equipped with modern functional furniture. There are 38 study carrels and additional reading facilities for approximately 30 persons.

Science departments have been successfully integrated, with the exception of the Biology department, which has its own library in the Biology Building. The collection in the Science Library includes books, periodicals, reports, indexes, abstracts and bibliographies. A number of these written by Acadia students are also available.

Many services are made available by this library. In addition

to the borrowing and browsing privileges, the staff is available to help with reference work. This library holds certain books in reserve and will arrange inter-library loans.

Library hours are posted on the door and efforts will be made to keep the Science Library open for the same number of hours as the Vaughan Library, depending on use and availability of staff.

Renaissance music lecture

On Tuesday, October 12, at 8:00 p.m. in Wheelock Lounge, Professor Eugen F. Gmeiner will speak on "Music in the Culture of the Renaissance". His presentation, which is part of the Acadia University Medieval and Renaissance Society's programme for the current year, will be illustrated with record-

ings of Renaissance music and colour slides of paintings by such artists as Leonardo da Vinci, Bosch, Bruegel and Parmigiano. Among the composers he will discuss are Josquin des Pres, Carlo Gesualdo, and Giovanni Gabrieli.

All faculty, students and members of the general public are invited to attend Professor

Gmeiner's presentation. There will be no charge and coffee will be served during the informal discussion period following Professor Gmeiner's presentation.

Professor Gmeiner is an Associate Professor in the Department of Music. He is also the University Organist and is well-known as a performer.

A native of California, Dr.

Moses is internationally known as a medical statistician. He gained world prominence for his work on the Halathen Study which reported on the comparative safety of various anaesthetics. He is also Past Chairman of the Department of Statistics at Stanford and is the author of numerous mathematical texts and papers.
