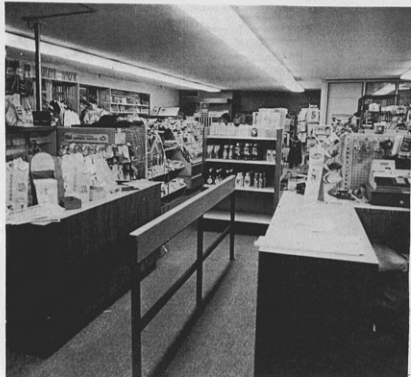

Acadia has also announced the appointment of Mr. David Nutbrown as Men's Head Basketball coach effective July 1, 1982. Coach Nutbrown will replace Ian MacMillan who leaves Acadia. Mr. Nutbrown was previously Head Coach for the University of Prince Edward Island men's basketball team.
